<h2>AIRE</h2>		<p>We have had a very exciting Children in Need (Pudsey bear) day on Aire Class today. The children have been great at sequencing phones and computers and the Year 3s have also been able to label objects with the correct decades. We are really excited because we decided to write letters to Grandparents to ask them to come into school or send letters, to help us to learn about what life was like for them when they were children. <h2>HUMBER</h2>		<p>Humber class have been very focussed this week as we learnt about remembrance day and the meaning behind it. We were very interested in this topic so we wrote our own free verse poems as a group to make sure that we had included lots of the tricky features within a poem. They were fantastic! We have also been very busy learning about the people of the Shang dynasty and thought about what it would be like during Shang times. <h2>OUSE</h2>		<p>This week in Ouse class, the children have been looking at how to write Flashback style stories. They have shown great collaboration during discussions and are showing a better understanding of how to write about it. Also we have had some fantastic homework brought in about The Beatles. <h2>TRENT</h2>		<p>Showing ownership of their learning assembly, confidence oozed from the children in Trent Class as they delivered their lines on Wednesday.
