- Last Friday, we had a super Children in Need fundraising day in school with a non uniform day and afternoon activities in the hall. With your support and the efforts of Year 6 team, we generated an incredible £442.09 for this super cause.

Reflections on this week:

Grandparents visit and support to Derwent class. On Tuesday Derwent Class were delighted to be visited by a number of Grandparents. The children got the opportunity to ask questions about what life was like when they were children. What a wonderful enhancement to their history topic! A big thank you to all Grandparents who attended or passed on letters to help the children make history really come to life

Run Hide Tell - I have now talked to 5 of our 6 classes about our planned practises for 'invacuation' or 'lock-down' in school. Like we do for a 'fire drill' when we all evacuate the building, we will soon begin practising what to do if we all need to get inside the building in the extremely unlikely event of needing to secure our school premises for a lock down. In the book I have been sharing with the children there is a lovely line that says, 'You need not be scared, when you are prepared'. I have carefully pitched my conversation and discussion with children appropriately and I have to say I have been absolutely delighted with the mature, positive engagement shown by all of the children in school.

Sikh Visitor: As I write this newsletter we are looking forward to a visit from Harkirat Singh, who is spending a day in school on Friday (22nd), leading an assembly and speaking to each class about life as a Sikh. This is a super way for children to learn more about Sikhism to increase their general religious awareness and knowledge. Thanks to Harkirat for coming into school, Mrs Burton for organising and also for Friends who have kindly funded the day to benefit all children in school.

Other news in brief:

- On Monday we welcomed our Friends from Carlton Methodist church to lead their 'Open the Book ' assembly. Thanks for your continued interest and support!
- Flu vaccinations were administered in school for those with signed consents on Wednesday. If your child did not receive the vaccination and you would like them to do so, the Healthy Child Team will be holding 'drop in' clinics at Selby North Children's Centre on Thursday 5th December and Thursday 19th December between 4pm and 5pm
- Photos were taken (again) in school on Thursday and proofs will be given out on Monday for ordering and delivery before Christmas

Dear Parents/Guardians,

MarvellousMe has updated their Parent app this week. This new version delivers a 30 day News Centre (the number one feature parents have been asking for), fixes notification bugs and includes other improvements.

You may have already seen an email from MarvellousMe however, if you haven't already done so, it is essential that you follow the instructions below:

1. Check your device is running the latest operating software
2. Update the MarvellousMe app via the App Stores or Google Play

To do this type 'MarvellousMe' into the search bar, click on the 'MarvellousMe' for parents' icon and select 'update'

Your phone may have already updated MarvellousMe automatically in which case it will just have an 'open' button

3. Open the MarvellousMe parent app then..

Tap 'settings'

Toggle the 'Get device notifications' switch off and back on again. Even if it shows as 'On', you must switch 'off' and 'one' once. This step is particularly important to ensure you receive MarvellousMe notifications going forward and benefit from the upgrade

IMPORTANT UPDATE

Please update your app to the latest version of MarvellousMe. It delivers new features, improvements and a notification overhaul.

- To get device notifications, please toggle the device notifications switch 'Off' and back 'On' again. Even if it shows as 'On', you must toggle it 'Off' and 'On' once to activate your device for the new notification system.
