Reflections on this week:

As always, there has been lots of lovely things happening in school this week. I personally really enjoyed spending time with Humber class this week, where I saw such mature attitudes to learning on display by the whole class. Well done to Miss Marshall, Mrs Swash and all of the Humber class children.

Another highlight this week for me was the informative and inspiring mini assemblies we held for Ouse (Year 5) and Trent (Year 6) on Wednesday. I was delighted to welcome Mr Silver (Eve's dad!) into school. Steve spoke to the children about being severely visually impaired. I certainly felt more informed as a result of this conversation and found out practical ways that we can all help make life a little easier for blind or visually impaired people around our community. The questions the children asked had genuine empathy and understanding. A huge thank you to Steve and Eve for sharing their story so honestly to help educate and inform our school community. A super effort! I am full of admiration and respect for the way Eve, Steve and all of the family have tackled their challenging journey.

This visit is to be repeated next week for Humber (Year 3&4) and Derwent classes (Year 2&3).

Last week:

We were delighted to host a visit from Sikh Education officer Harkirat Singh, on Friday (22nd), leading an assembly and speaking to each class about life as Sikh. It was such a calm, positive and informative session, enjoyed across the school. This was a super way for children to learn more about Sikhism to increase their general religious awareness and knowledge. Thanks to Harkirat for coming into school. Mrs Burton for organising and also for Friends who kindly funded the day.

Trips:

At present we only have 54% of contributions (£2.87) for the children in Year 2,3 and 4 to attend the Kings Church Christmas experience. We also only have 71% of contributions (£12.00) for our Whole School Panto trip. A reminder that all contributions are very much welcomed and appreciated in order to make such brilliant experiences for the children viable. <h2>AIRE</h2>	 	<p>This week in Aire class we have been looking at 2D shape. We started by watching the Numberblocks episode Flatland where number four and his pet squarey visit Flatland and turn into real shapes. They meet lots of different shapes on their adventures. We then looked at each shape to learn its name and properties, before putting our knowledge into practise. We have had fantastic fun making shape pictures and winding shape paths around the classroom and outdoors. We had to use our mathematical language to describe what we were doing.</p>
<h2>CALDER</h2>		<p>This week in Calder Class we have been working on our story Elf Road. We have been thinking about the emotions of the main character and how his feelings change as the story goes on. We acted out the story and showed the change in emotions through our drama. We then made emotions charts to track how he changed from the beginning until the end.</p>
<h2>DERWENT</h2>	 	<p>This week Derwent Class have started their measuring topic in Maths. Year 2 have been learning how to measure accurately using rulers and metre sticks. The children have been using centimetres and metres and sometimes both. Year 3 have been using millimetres, centimetres and metres in their measuring. The children have really enjoyed the practical maths and I have been impressed with the collaboration they have shown.</p>
<h2>HUMBER</h2>	 	<p>This week we have been learning lots of pencil skills in art, this has helped us understand how to create different tones and shades within our images. We worked hard to control the pressure that we put on our pencil. We have used a huge amount of determination this week to master solving 2-digit divided by 1-digit problems, we found this father tricky at first but when we worked hard using our determination, resilience and collaboration we all became masters!</p>
<h2>OUSE</h2>		<p>In Ouse Class this week they have shown a good understanding to the start of their music lessons. They are looking at music by The Beatles specifically focusing on the song Blackbird. They will be listening, appraising and learning facts about other Beatles songs as well.</p>
<h2>TRENT</h2>		<p>In order to enhance the children's understanding of having a disability, specifically being visually impaired, Mr Silver visited Trent Class to share his experiences. Through demonstrations and explanations, he described his daily challenges and shared what small actions can be taken by the fully sighted to help him, and others in a similar situation. The children listened intently and asked pertinent questions, which both delighted and impressed Mr Silver, whose answers provided the children with the skills to further improve their abilities as good citizens to help others. Thank you Mr Siler and Eve for giving us this superb opportunity for enlightenment.</p>
