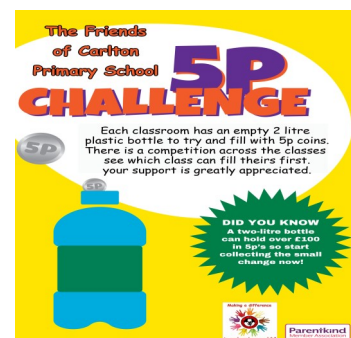
During the day staff will be swapping roles, so who knows who will be serving dinner, sweeping up or answering the phone!

Our Year ones met Blockzilla. A monster who lives in Numberblock land who loves to compare numbers and eat them. We used Blockzilla to learn the mathematical signs for Greater than, Less than and equal to. The children loved making and using their own Blockzilla and then used it to compare the size of objects and cubes, before moving onto number cards. They were amazing!</p> |
| <h2>CALDER</h2>  |    | <p>As part of our brilliant 'Big Me' day on Friday, Calder class dressed up as a person doing the job they wished to do when they grow up. It was so lovely to hear all of their aspirations! We have also been busy with our maths this week, learning all about measurement!
