This means that on the **1**st **January 2021 we officially become 'Carlton Primary School' and join Selby Educational Trust (SET)** as planned.

The Governors and I feel this is a really exciting and positive step for our school. Support from SET will help us continue to improve and blossom even further. We are proud of our school and are incredibly optimistic about the direction of travel and this partnership working. Here's to a great new chapter for all connected to **Carlton Primary School** and a great 2021!

There will be no sudden changes – we will just be continuing our usual approach, with a drive and focus to continually develop and improve our school. Our school ethos, character and atmosphere will remain the same. As you know uniform will not change but in time the old badge will be phased out on our signs, school documents and on new uniform purchased. Also, in the first weeks of January our website and email addresses will change – I will inform you all about this on the other side of the holidays.

Our governors board have all been re-elected as a SET committee, so will all continue their valued work with me, strategic leading the school.

During our earthquake's topic in Geography the children had a go at building earthquakeproof structures. They were given uncooked spaghetti and marshmallows and had to work together to create a structure that would not fall over when the table was shaking. The children soon discovered the strategies that wouldn't work and those that would. You can see a couple of different ideas here.





Our DT topic this half term was pulleys, levers and linkages. The children researched and designed their very own cranes before bringing in materials from home to build them. They worked in groups to create their designs using counter weights to balance them and pulley systems for carrying loads.
