This week has been a really enjoyable and productive week. We started the week in a lovely manner with our 'good to be gold' celebration, with children choosing two activities to participate in on Monday afternoon. This was our whole school reward for behaviour - we reached our target of 50 Gold leaves total!

We had some visitors in school this week to check in on some of the good progress we are making with key school improvement issues. I personally have enjoyed visiting Aire, Calder and Derwent classes with Miss Bingham, a lead practitioner from The English Hub, to see how well our staff team are delivering our new Phonics scheme that we have adopted. On Wednesday, I also had the pleasure of talking at length to Ian Clennan, National leader of Education and local Head teacher, on Wednesday about our school's broad and rich curriculum and further progression. A productive 2 days of visits!

Outside of school, I was lucky to attend one of the five nights of 'Young Voices' at Sheffield Arena this week. I saw some of our local schools taking part in this quite simply speaking, inspiring event. The night I was there, I witnessed 5031 primary pupils singing with passion and confidence to a packed arena crowd, performing with and likes of The Shires and Tony Hadley for example. I sat there and I decided very quickly that I want our children to have this opportunity to participate next year. I have registered interest for next year (likely to be Jan 2021 – with preparation throughout the autumn term Sept 2020). I hope many of the families in school will express an interest in this superb out of school event. I have spoken to the pupils about this in assembly and gained a positive response. More to follow!
