Important News:

Update re change of end of day:

Your co-operation with <u>drop off and pickup arrangements</u> has been really appreciated. As you know because of Covid restrictions, we established an extended 'pick up window from 3.05pm to 3.20pm. In reflection, we have decided to shorten this window and in doing we are able to 'claw back' valuable curriculum time. Pickups are simply not taking 15 minutes. Therefore, **from Monday 16th November 2020 onwards we will not be opening the door for collection until 3.10pm.** The school gate will not be unlocked until after 3.05pm. Many people have been arriving at the start of the window – you not all need to be there at 3.10 - we want a window of pick up times to avoid congestion, to help with social distancing and to help keep everyone safe. You are not late (despite what the children may say) if you are picking up at 3.15pm or 3.18pm!

To confirm Pick up times are now 3.10pm to 3.20pm.
