In school

Covid Restrictions

It is a strange time for our country, with the promise of restrictions easing extremely soon, more people being vaccinated against Covid and cases on the dramatic rise again, affecting many people. Many local schools are currently having bubble closures and in extreme cases full closure like we sadly experienced in September. We all want to get to the end of the year without any further impact on our school and community.

With that in mind, like so many other schools who remain open for one week after the likely removal of restrictions (week beginning Monday 19th July) WE WILL NOT BE CHANGING ANY COVID RELATED PROCEDURES. That means we will be continuing to wear face masks, maintain one ways systems, having limited access to parents into school (e.g. one at a time in main entrance and no parents into classrooms) until the end of term. Any changes we choose to make will not come into effect until September and will be carefully risk-assessed and communicated to you before the start of the new school year.

I want to keep our children, staff team, families and communities and safe as possible. We will do all we can to ensure we avoid bubble closures before the end of term.
