helping staff to improve their confidence, skills and knowledge which in turn will benefit the opportunities input and curriculum offer the children will receive.

### Important reminders:

### Potential New Houses and Local Developments in Carlton

As I'm sure you are all aware, all local residents received a flyer this week re another potential new housing development at 'Station Road'. This potential development, which is at consultation point, would obviously bring additional families into the village. As some of you may have seen on facebook there has been lots of comments about the impact of new housing on facilities in the village.

Whilst fully understanding concerns re traffic, change of feel, and other important factors, I want to be clear that as a school, Carlton Primary would welcome additional pupils – this would make us even more financially viable and secure.

Current status: As I have previously stated our 'current pupil capacity' is 196 – 28 per year group. This week we have 153 pupils on roll and as things stand will have 156 on roll in September 2022. A typical year group currently has 20-24 pupils. We have about 30 spaces/capacity as things stand for September 2022. Clearly if in time, we were to get closer to 196, with various development in the potential pipeline, then further discussion would be had at Local Authority and Trust Level about what would happen.

FYI I am informed that NYCC work on 1 primary aged pupil per 4 new houses.

We will continue to be a 6 classes school in September 2022 for the 7 year groups – this means we will again have some mixed age classes, as we have had throughout my 7 years at the school. Ideally for September 2023 I want us to be a 7 class school – one class per year group. This would be of huge positive impact for us in terms of our curriculum planning and mapping. Securing some additional pupils would really help us in this regard.
