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Hot weather plan: Monday 18th July and Tuesday 19th July

As I'm sure you are already aware, the MET office have issued weather alerts for extremely hot weather on Monday (18th) and Tuesday (19th) July. As a result, we are going to put some additional measures in place in school to try and make the children as comfortable as we possibly can. We have a duty and desire to keep your child safe. Please help us to do so, by taking the information below into account.

Uniform on Monday & Tuesday

We are relaxing uniform for these 2 days. Children can come to school in clothes in which they will hopefully be a little cooler and more comfortable wearing. A loose-fitting t-shirt (preferably cotton) and shorts or summer dress would be ideal – these can be the children's usual school uniform, or P.E kits, or a suitable alternative.

The emphasis is on light, cooler clothing rather than a 'non-uniform day' - Please make sensible choices!

I don't consider that jeans, denim shorts, leggings or a tracksuits etc are advisable and will in fact be warmer than usual uniform. Please do not send children in strapped/sleeveless tops — as they will be more exposed to the sun. Trainers and sandals are fine — but please no flip flops or sliders.

Lunches, breaks and activities:

- The children may not be going outside at lunchtime, or not for as long as usual, as this will be close to the hottest part of the day.
- Where possible, if we are outside for short periods, we will use shaded areas.

Other measures:

- During the day we will be regularly opening doors to allow some air flow and children will have regular little walks around school or outside into the shade, to allow the temperature in the classrooms to lower a little and fresher air to circulate.
- There will be no PE or activities with high levels of physical movement or exertion.
- Teachers will take the children outside for short periods of time and sit in shaded areas.
- We will monitor and risk assess the situation throughout this unusually warm period.

Water bottles, Sun Cream and Hats:

It is so important that your child has high factor sun-cream on before they arrive at school. We advise children to wear a sun hat.

It is vital that all children have water bottles. We have been quite surprised by the number of children who have not had water bottles in school recently. Please support us to keep your child safe and healthy be ensuring they have their bottle with them each day. The children will be encouraged to drink water throughout the day and we have fountains around school where children can refill their bottles.

Key Stage 2 Data

It wanted to share with you all our recent Key Stage 2 National Curriculum test results – these were released to school on Tuesday 5th July.

The Reading, Maths and Grammar Punctuation and Spelling results are taken from the SATs/National Curriculum tests that our year 6 children took in May 2022. The Writing data is based upon our externally moderated Teacher Assessment.

We are pleased with the data and delighted with the attitude and efforts of the year 6 children. It is good to see that in all aspects, we are above the provisional National Data provided by the Department of Education (DfE). FYI This is the first Nationally collected data for 3 years because of the Covid pandemic.
