

Age related art vocabulary			
Horizontal	Something is parallel to the plane of the horizon	Shading	The darkening or colouring with parallel lines or a block of colour.
Vertical	Something is at a right angle to a horizontal plane where the top is directly above the bottom.	Cross-hatching	Shade an area with intersecting sets of parallel lines.
Intersect	Two or more things pass or lie across each other.	Grade	The numbers and letters that show the hardness or softness of the pencil lead.
Portrait	A painting, drawing, photograph, or engraving of a person, especially one of the face, or head and shoulders.	Contemporary	Belonging to or occurring in the present.







Key Knowledge

- Shading can be used to add tone to a portrait especially around the eyes, nose and hair.
- When cross-hatching if the lines are further closer together it will create a darker effect.
- A variety of directions of lines can be used when cross-hatching.
- Portraits are a type of art that shows a persons face or head and shoulders.
- Pencil grades can be used to help identify the appropriate pencil when sketching.
- If a pencil is marked with a letter H it has a hard lead. The higher the number on a H pencil the harder the lead. A Hard lead pencil will draw alight mark. H pencils are ideal for precision drawing
- If a pencil is marked with a b this shows a softer lead. The higher the number with the b mark the softer and darker the pencil. The softer pencils are easy to smudge and blend and are ideal for a wide range of shading techniques.
