<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bookmarks are used to keep hold of a page in a book so you do not lose your place. • Different types of materials include cloth, fabric, felt, wood, metal, plastic and many more. • Textiles are any material made of interlacing fibres (e.g. carpets). • A running stitch is where the needle is passed in and out of the fabric in a straight row.
