- Reverenced Becky and I led assemblies on Monday talking about Harvest.

Next week:

<u>Harvest Celebrations:</u> As previously shared, we have our Harvest celebration next Tuesday (11th October 2022) at 11.15am. We are welcoming volunteers to walk with us to church - and these people will be invited to be our small 'audience'. If you wish to support us walking to and from church and attend the Harvest celebrations, please do let the admin team know, so we know who to expect and have an idea of numbers.

- Year 6 parents A reminder that it is already that time of year when you need to be selecting the secondary/high school for your child for September 2023. In order to secure your first choice, all application must be made by 31st October 2022.
- <u>Joining Carlton in September 2023.</u> Another reminder that it is also that time of year when parents need to be thinking about **reception intake for September 2023**. Carlton Conker Competition.

Children will be starting our conker competition in school soon.

Your child will be bringing home a conker today/start of next week. **We would appreciate it if you could string the conker so your child can participate please!** Please see and follow the rules below!

Carlton Conker rules

- You must not bake or soak your conker
- Player 1 starts hitting first
- They keep hitting until they miss
- If the strings get tangled the first player to shout 'Strings' continues to hit
- If the conker comes off the string that person is out
- If the string and conker end up on the floor we do not play 'stamps'. The player will just pick up the conker and continue playing.
- At the end of each round, if there is no winner the class teacher will examine both conkers and see which has the most damage. The person with the least damage will progress to the next round.
- If there is the same amount of damage then each person will see how many 'knocks' they can achieve in 1 minute. Whoever gets the most will proceed to the next round
- The year group champions will be given a new conker for the championship tournament which will be strung for them in school

The Finals will be played between year group winners and in school before the half term holidays

Good to be Gold – a reminder of what we do!

As part of our whole school system for praising and celebrating good behaviour we have a Good to Be Gold whole school reward system. The tree is in the school hall and referred to in assembly – it is our visual way of representing our behaviour reward system.

Each week each class can earn 'gold' points – these are awarded for each class as follows:

- 90% of class or more in Gold all week = 2 points
- 80% of class (up to 90%) Gold all week = I point

If all 6 classes get 2 Gold points then I give a bonus 5points to the whole school.

Additional points can also be gained for individuals or groups who are receive a Red Book entry in special mentions assembly. Each Red Book counts as one point for the target!.

When we reach our school target of 50 points we have a whole school reward. The more people who stay gold then the more points are scored, and the sooner we have the next whole school celebration. This promotes team work throughout school and praises good behaviour.

It is lovely to again share lots of positive news of out of school achievements, This week we spotlight Lucas (Y6) for his Golf.

During the summer holidays Lucas was selected to represent the York union junior team in a couple of competitions, and then a couple of weeks ago he was also selected for the Yorkshire county under 14 squad. This is a huge honour for someone of his age.
