

<p>Muslims (recap from Y1)</p>  <p>Allah</p> <p>Arabic</p>	<p>Muslims follow a religion called Islam.</p> <p>Muslims believe that the world would not function without God, the Muslim word for God is in the Arabic language: Allah.</p> <p>Muslims never draw Allah. They say all pictures of Allah are wrong and Allah is too great for pictures!</p> <p>Arabic is a language spoken in Arabian parts of southwestern Asia, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Egypt, and parts of</p>	<p>Mosque (recap from Y1)</p> 	<p>A Muslim holy building is called a mosque – a special place for Muslims.</p> <p>Anywhere a Muslim chooses for prayer is believed to become a mosque for that particular time</p>
<p>Holy Qu’ran</p> <p>sacred (recap from Y1)</p>	<p>The Holy Qur’an: is sacred text for Muslims . It is written in Arabic. It is a guide to help Muslims live their lives</p> <p>Sacred means considered to be holy and deserving respect, especially because of a connection with a god</p>	<p>Prophet Muhammad</p>	<p>The Prophet Muhammad is the Muslim leader</p> <p>Prophet Muhammad is such a special leader that he has over 1.5 billion followers who respect him, all over the world.</p>
		<p>Ramadan</p> <p>Eid-ul-Fitr</p>	<p>Eid takes place at the end of Ramadan - a month of prayer and fasting. The name "Eid al-Fitr" translates as "the festival of the breaking of the fast".</p>
