





Key Knowledge

- Most **plural forms of nouns used add 's'** e.g. 'Le monstre a trois oreilles'.
- Exceptions to the rule:**
 - ⇒ un œil (one eye) is 'les yeux' (eyes) in the plural form e.g. 'Le monstre a deux yeux';
 - ⇒ Nez (nose) does not change in plural form.
- Most **adjectives go after the noun** they describe e.g. 'un nez rouge'...
- Compound sentences can be made using 'et' (and), 'avec' (with) and 'mais' (but).
