- Wassily Kandinsky (1866-1944) is a Russian, abstract artist.
- Piet Mondrian (1872-1944) is a Dutch painter. He created abstract art and liked to use the primary colours.
- Henri Matisse (1869-1954). When he was unable to paint anymore, he created pictures using cutup pieces of paper (collages).
- George Seurat (1859-1891) created pointillism, which is making paintings using dots of paint.
- The primary colours are red, yellow and blue.
- Microsoft Paint has many different tools including a pencil, paintbrush, fill, erase, shapes etc.
