<p>Key Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You need to use a username and password to log onto a computer. Digital painting is a form of art completed on a computer. Wassily Kandinsky (1866-1944) is a Russian, abstract artist. Piet Mondrian (1872-1944) is a Dutch painter. He created abstract art and liked to use the primary colours. Henri Matisse (1869-1954). When he was unable to paint anymore, he created pictures using cut-up pieces of paper (collages). George Seurat (1859-1891) created pointillism, which is making paintings using dots of paint. The primary colours are red, yellow and blue. Microsoft Paint has many different tools including a pencil, paintbrush, fill, erase, shapes etc.
