<p><b>Key Knowledge</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Computers help you in many different ways. You can find things out by looking on the web. You can write, draw, do maths, make charts and graphs or make music.</li> <li>• The internet is made of computers connected to each other around the world. Words and pictures can be sent from one computer to another. When you use websites and some apps, you are using the internet.</li> <li>• Computers have programs called browsers, which are used to access the world wide web (www). The web is one of the most important uses of the internet. There are lots of websites on the internet.</li> <li>• Personal information tells other people who you are and where to find you. Things like your name, address, school and what you look like. You should not share this kind of information with people you don't know.</li> <li>• What do you do if you click on a website which has pictures or words that upset you? Press the minimise button to hide the website. You can tell an adult you trust that you have seen something that upset you.</li> </ul>
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
