Key Knowledge	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> In tag rugby, the ball is only allowed to be passed sideways or backwards. Do not block or protect your tags. Use an underarm throw with 2 hands. Run into a space when you receive the ball and watch the ball as it is coming towards you. Pass the ball if you have been tagged. Position yourself behind or to the side of the ball carrier to support them. Use small steps to be able to change direction quickly - double dodge to lose a defender Use the rules you have learnt to play fairly: <p>3 seconds to pass the ball if tagged</p> <p>3 tags in one attacking play and the ball goes to the opposition</p> <p>Tagger must hand back the tag before rejoining the game</p> <p>Pass the ball backwards or sideways.</p>
