Key Knowledge

- 1. In tag rugby, the ball is only allowed to be passed sideways or backwards.
- 2. Do not block or protect your tags.
- 3. Use an underarm throw with 2 hands.
- 4. Run into a space when you receive the ball and watch the ball as it is coming towards you.
- 5. Pass the ball if you have been tagged.
- 6. Position yourself behind or to the side of the ball carrier to support them.
- 7. Use small steps to be able to change direction quickly double dodge to lose a defender
- 8. Use the rules you have learnt to play fairly:
 - 3 seconds to pass the ball if tagged
 - 3 tags in one attacking play and the ball goes to the opposition

Tagger must hand back the tag before rejoining the game

Pass the ball backwards or sideways.
