Key Knowledge

- The Second World War was a war over land and was called the World War because many countries of the World became involved. The War began in 1939 and ended in 1945.
- All men were expected to go to war and fight for their country. The women stayed at home and took over the men's jobs and the children in the cities were evacuated.
- The causation of WW2 is linked to legacies of WW1. Germany was left bankrupt after paying its compensation from WW1 so people began to resent the jews for having jobs and money. Hitler rose to power and invaded Poland. Britain issued an ultimatum which Germany ignored therefore Britain declared War on Germany.
- The Blitz were bombing raids that Germany launched against Britain during WW2. For eight months German airplanes dropped bombs on London and other cities, including Birmingham, Coventry, Sheffield, Liverpool, Plymouth, Southampton, Portsmouth, and Manchester.
- There were three main waves of evacuations during WW2 where children were sent to live in the countryside away from the bombing.
