<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are many different mark making techniques such as short lines, long lines, curved lines, circles, stippling and hatching.</li> <li>• Lightly pressing on your pencil makes it much easier to erase when you are drawing.</li> <li>• Composition means the way parts of something are put together or organised.</li> <li>• An outline is a line or shape showing the outside edge of an object or figure.</li> </ul>
