<u>The end of this week has been particularly enjoyable.</u> Today (Friday) we held our Good to be Gold Celebration morning. This is because before Christmas we reached our 50 Gold points whole school target and are already well on the way to the next 50points too.

This celebration is part of our behaviour policy, were we celebrate our good behaviour in school by having a reward session. The children who have been Gold all of the time during the week that the 50 points were earned, get to participate in all of their chosen activities. For some children there is some quiet reflection time too, if they received sanctions in the time frame, before they join the celebration.



We also are set to hold our first celebration assembly of 2023 this afternoon, and we have special

mentions, some certificates for the highest scorers in each class in term 1 for 'Marvellous Me's' and even a Red Book entry to share today.

I am delighted that Miss Gray, who knows the children brilliantly and works with them lots across the week already, will cover the class whilst Mis Marshall is not in school. Miss Gray is one of our 2 Higher Level teaching Assistants in school, and is a qualified teacher.

Other news:

- <u>Works experience pupils</u>: It has been great having Jack and Bea in school this week on works experience from Holy Family Catholic High School. Both have conducted themselves in a mature and positive way, with Bea supporting in Cheetahs /reception and Jack across school, particularly in PE lessons. It has been lovely welcoming Jack a former Carlton pupil back into school, and seeing what a mature, kind and well-mannered young man he is!
- Premises & Maintenance:
 - Our new boilers are now fully operational! Hopefully moving forward they will be more energy efficient which will help us in these challenging financial times.
 - As part of our ongoing commitment to further improving our school environment, we have had one of our shelters/ Gazebo/ outdoor classroom roof repaired this week.
- <u>School Clubs:</u> You should have received our clubs letter today, outlining the clubs staff are offering for the term ahead. Obviously Young Voices has already begun, as they prepare for their big event on 10th February.
- <u>Reception Pupils for September 2023:</u> As I said last week, over the last few weeks and months I have been showing round lots of families and children who will be or who are considering joining our school in September next year. We are really pleased with the positive feedback from our visits and the number of applications we have received. We are quickly approaching the deadline for applications - 15th January 2023!</u>
