Industrial Action by NEU

I have written to you all earlier today (via parentmail) with regards to our response for the planned industrial action/ strike by the National Education Union on Wednesday 1^{st} February 2023. Like many schools locally and nationally we will be seriously affected by this action.

I'm now in the position to be able to make a final decision for our school. I want to give you as much notice as possible that **Carlton Primary School will be closed to pupils on Wednesday 1**st **February 2023.** This closure is because of the number of teachers from CPS who are on strike and therefore I have no option but to close the school.

As I outlined last week, these strikes are happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and conditions, and not because of any issues at our school.

I'm sorry for the disruption to you and to your child's education and I understand that this situation may be frustrating for you. I also acknowledge that this is a serious matter and that is a very complex and difficult decision for professionals to make, especially for my teaching team who care so deeply for the children. I ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect.

I will communicate next week about arrangements for families who are entitled to free school meals.

The day will be packed full of songs, positive messages and enjoyment. I'm sure it will be absolutely brilliant for the children and comes highly recommended!


