Key Knowledge

- The primary colours are red, blue, yellow. These colours cannot be made by mixing other colours together.
- The secondary colours are orange, purple and green. These colours are created by the equal mixture of two primary colours.

COLOR MIXING

RED + YELLOW = ORANGE

YELLOW + BLUE = GREEN

BLUE + RED = PURPLE
