Key Knowledge

- Eid al-Adha means festival of the sacrifice.
- Prophet Ibrahim (Peace be Upon him) had a vision of Allah who spoke to him and commanded him to sacrifice his son in order to show obedience and loyalty.
- Prophet Ibrahim (Peace be Upon Him) followed Allah's commands and fulfilled the vision through his intentions therefore his son was saved.
- Eid is celebrated by decorating homes, making cards, decorating females hands with mehndi patterns, sacrificing a lamb and sharing out meat with family, friends and the poor.
- Hajj is a pilgrimage (spiritual journey) to Makkah in Saudi Arabia.
- Hajj is one of the 5 pillars of Islam.
- All Muslims who are fit enough should make the journey at least once in their lives.
