The Cross: Christians believe it is a symbol of the power of love.								
Jesus was a 'man with a mission': It had 5 points -to give poor people good news, to free prisoners, to help the blind to see, to give liberty to oppressed people and to tell people God would bless them this year.								
Parables are stories from the Bible that help us to learn about the values of Christianity								
Christians believe in forgiveness, generosity, justice and fairness								
Christians often see the process of moral choice as temptation to do wrong. They resist temptation by prayer, using the Bible or working together in fellowship								
Many Christians like to give a percentage of their money to God's work. Some give up to 10% (sometimes called 'tithing', and based on practice from before the time of Jesus in the Bible).
