Key Knowledge

- The Cross: Christians believe it is a symbol of the power of love.
- Jesus was a ‘man with a mission’: It had 5 points -to give poor people good news, to free prisoners, to help the blind to see, to give liberty to oppressed people and to tell people God would bless them this year.
- Parables are stories from the Bible that help us to learn about the values of Christianity
- Christians believe in forgiveness, generosity, justice and fairness
- Christians often see the process of moral choice as temptation to do wrong. They resist temptation by prayer, using the Bible or working together in fellowship
- Many Christians like to give a percentage of their money to God’s work. Some give up to 10% (sometimes called ‘tithing’, and based on practice from before the time of Jesus in the Bible).
