Key Knowledge

- 1. French markets are great places for buying fresh produce, especially fruit and vegetables.
- 2. Remember not to pronounce the **'s'** at the end of plurals.
- 3. When making a vegetable plural, most of the time add on an **'s'** with the exception of **choux** (cabbages). Be careful with pomme<u>s</u> de terre (potatoes).
- 4. When in conversation, hesitation, gestures, apologising and asking (in French) for repetition are helpful strategies.
