A lovely visit for the children. <u>Absence</u>: We have had a lots of pupil and staff absence this week – well wishes to everyone who has not been well! <u>Important info school debt.</u> At the point of writing this newsletter the current debt to school for lunches and Carlton Owls is a staggering £1140 – as a small school we cannot cover this cost and need everyone to contribute fairly. If you have any arrears with us please do make a payment, and/ or if needed please speak to the admin team or myself to have a discussion about a payment plan.

<u>Assessments</u>

Across school the children have been completing their PUMA tests (Maths) and PIRA tests (Reading) as part of our end of term assessments. This is part of a long standing termly data collection to monitor progress and attainment. It has been great seeing children trying their best and approach these tests with great attitudes.

In May Year 6 pupils (from Tigers class) take their Key Stage 2 National Curriculum tests or SATs (week beginning Tues 9th May). In addition, Year 2 children (Leopards class) will be completing their end of Key Stage 1 assessments the following week (Monday 15th May). Both of these sets of standardised tests are compulsory and taken by all pupils across the country.

Year 6: Miss Craven and team, and of course the pupils themselves, have been working hard as we start to prepare for these important assessments. Unlike some schools we have ensured the children still have access to a rich, broad and balanced curriculum rather than purely focusing on Reading, Writing, and Maths. However, we are now also giving the children opportunities to complete practise papers, in order for them to experience the style of questions and gain familiarity of the experience, so that they can give their best account of themselves in the formal tests. We want the children to be prepared but not daunted or worried – we want them to be able to showcase their talents and show what they know!

It is really important that both Year 2 and Year 6 pupils have particularly excellent attendance over the next few weeks either side of the Easter break.

Easter plans

As outlined last week we have a variety of Easter celebrations planned next week:

- <u>Church Visit</u>: On Tuesday 28th March 2023 at 2.00pm we are visiting St Mary's Church in Carlton for an Easter Assembly and service with Reverend Becky. We will again welcome volunteers to help walk with us to church and back. Please let the office know if you are able to help. We will be departing school at approx. 1.40/1.45pm.
- Egg Decorating Competition: We are holding a 'Easter Egg decorating competition' again this year. This will be a chance, for those who wish to participate, to decorate hard boiled eggs at home, in any style or form they wish.
 We are making it easier this year and just having prize winners for each class regardless of whether the children have done them with support from adults or independently.
 We will be asking for the decorated eggs to be brought in Thursday 30th March. Judging will take place on Friday 31st March and winners will be announced that same day this is the last day of term.

• <u>Easter raffle – Mrs Pierce has organised a Friends' Easter Raffle. All money raised will be</u> spent directly on the children in school. For example, funding the Easter Bunny's visit!

Tickets went on sale from Monday 20th March - £1 per entry and are still available. Please send any money for tickets in a named envelope to your child's teacher. In return for every £1 received we will enter your child's name into a prize draw.
