- Primary colours—Red, Yellow Blue
- Secondary colours—Purple green and orange
- Complimentary/Contrasting colours—Sit opposite each other on the colour wheel and include all
 3 of the primary colours
- One-point perspective—Showing how objects appear to get smaller as they get further away
- Light sources—Looking at the angle of the light on an object and how that effects it's brightness.
