Holi- Hindu festival that celebrates spring, love, and new life and the victory of good over evil

Hola Mohalla- Sikh festival which focuses on being brave and prepared

Key Knowledge

- Some families hold religious ceremonies, but for many Holi is more a time for fun. It's a colourful festival, with dancing, singing and throwing of powder paint and coloured water.
- Holi is also known as the "festival of colours".
- Holi marks the arrival of spring and the end of winter. It is usually celebrated in March
- Holi also celebrates the Hindu god Krishna and the legend of Holika and Prahlad
- Hola Mohalla takes place the day after Holi and lasts for 3 days
- People hold mock battles during Hola Mohalla to remember the importance of being brave and being ready
- Hola means the charge of an army, Mohalla means an organised procession
