- Guest assemblies: This week we had 2 guest assemblies:
 - On Monday Reverend Becky part led our assembly and talked about how special our planet is ,how special animals are and how Christians believe in creation.
 - On Wednesday we had Sharon visit us again and lead our whole school assembly on the Jewish religion. Sharon visited our school earlier in the academic year to talk about the Jewish festival Hanukkah. This time is was a more general overview of the Jewish religion. Important information re National Education Union's Strike Action on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July 2023. As previously stated, it is highly likely that the NEU strikes will result in Carlton Primary School being closed for those two days. I am sorry for the inconvenience this will cause.

As with previous strike days, we will again , if required, be providing support for vulnerable children and children of critical workers (NHS staff and other emergency services). Tesco Community Grant: Carlton Primary School's Nature Garden Regeneration bid

Attention everyone who shops at Tesco! We are seeking financial support from the Tesco grant for our Nature Garden Regeneration. This project is to develop our outdoor area where children can explore wildlife and develop outdoor forest school skills, whilst also learning about growing food and produce.

I am delighted to share with you that our application to the Tesco Community Grants Scheme has been successful and our project will be put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores. Voting will commence in store from the <u>first week of July 2023 until the end of September 2023.</u>

The project with the highest number of votes across our region will receive £1,500 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), the second placed project £1,000 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), and the third placed project £500.
