The children enjoyed the sessions and engaged really well with this special /enhanced P.E activity. - Uniform. On PE days, we ask that children come to school in approved PE kit, as outlined on the school website. On all other days, children are expected to attend in their correct uniform. We thank parents for helping us ensure that we maintain our uniform standards in these remaining weeks up to summer.
