<p>Key Knowledge</p> <p><u>Chronology:</u></p> <p>The ancient Kingdom of Benin was in what is now Nigeria.</p> <p>It was around AD 900 when the Benin kingdom started to develop.</p> <p>The original people and founders of the Benin Kingdom were ruled by the Ogiso (meaning ‘Kings of the Sky’).</p> <p><u>Interpretation</u></p> <p>Artefacts from Benin history have been found and are on display in many museums after historians have analysed them and made interpretations</p> <p><u>Enquiry</u></p> <p>There are many different versions of the story as old African tales have been passed down through word of mouth which means they may have been modified over the years.</p> <p><u>Causation</u></p> <p>The slave trade ultimately brought about the end of the Benin Kingdom, British, Portuguese and Dutch kingdoms were more powerful and traded African people across the world.</p> <p><u>Communication</u></p>
