As you know each school year we hold 3 shows at Carlton: one at Christmas, one at Easter and one in the summer, with each class taking part in one of these. This is an embedded part of our school culture. We love to encourage children to perform, and our love of singing and of music in general is established. It is also a great way of demonstrating teamwork and collaboration.
