<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prehistory is the time before written records began, we know about this time period from sources of evidence left behind.</li> <li>• During this time there were different ages – Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.</li> <li>• People migrated to Britain during the Stone Age and survived as hunter-gatherers.</li> <li>• As tools became more advanced and settlements appeared, the use of metals meant the Stone Age became the Bronze Age and eventually, the Iron Age.</li> </ul>
