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Key Knowledge

The Romans left Britain in 410 AD 

Normans took over England in 1066 when they won the Battle of Hastings– this was the end of the Saxon period 

Anglo Saxons and Scots invaded and began to **settle** in Britain in 449 AD 

Alfred the Great was King of Wessex and, later, all of England in 871 AD 

Saxon jobs included ploughing ground, making bread, Smith, Tanner, Weaver, Jeweller, Woodworker, Potter, growing crops, tending to livestock

Artefacts are items from a specific time period. They help us to understand the past as we can see what type of tools they made and art they enjoyed. 

Saxons created 7 **kingdoms** in England– these were Northumbria, Essex, Wessex, Sussex, Mercia, Kent and East Anglia.
