

Key Knowledge

- In French, we need to blend the article into the noun, for example, in 'les yeux' it should sound like, 'lay zee-uh'.
- 'Jacques a dit' is the French version of 'Simon says'. It can be used to help us follow instructions and learn certain pieces of vocabulary.
- Possessive adjectives agree with the noun 'son' for masculine (le) / 'sa' feminine (la), for example 'la bouche' would become sa bouche, meaning 'her mouth'.
- We can describe ourselves by using the 'J'ai + number + body part' frame. For example, 'J'ai deux mains. We need to remember plurals here!
- For plural body parts, usually an 's' is added onto the end of the noun. However, the
 exceptions to this rule are, le nez (it doesn't change) and les yeux (eux is a plural ending).
