### Key Knowledge

French is spoken in many countries around the world including Canada, Central African Republic and Belgium - look at the posters below!

'Bonjour', can be used as a formal greeting whereas 'salut' can be used as an informal greeting between friends.

Questions such as 'comment ca va?' and 'comment t'appelles tu?', can be asked whilst raising shoulders and hands to demonstrate that a question is being asked.

Some English names have a French equivalent.

Notice the spelling pattern for appelle = 2 of everything except 'a'.
