Key Knowledge

- When we are pronouncing the 'ère' spelling we say this as 'air'.
- The French word for sister (soeur) is pronounced 'sir'.
- In this unit we use the verb 'avoir' which means 'to have'. We will start to become confident with different forms of the verb and therefore different verb endings; J'ai, tu as, il/elle a. This means 'I have, you have, he/she has'. This is important when talking about our family.
- If someone is an only child they would say, 'je suis enfant unique'.
