<b>Focus: What do religions say to us when life gets hard?</b>			
Age related vocabulary			
<b>Heaven</b>	This is a belief held by some religions and is the place, sometimes imagined to be in the sky, where God or the gods live. Good people are believed to go here after they die.	<b>Reincarnation</b>	People are born again in another body after they die and this cycle continues over many lifetimes. This is a Hindu belief.
<b>Suffering</b>	This is the undergoing of pain or distress. Religions attempt to explain suffering by helping people understand, cope and learn from it.	<b>Salvation</b>	This means being saved from sin (wrongdoing), and Christians believe that salvation is essential to have a relationship with God while on earth, and to have eternal life with God in heaven after death.

<p><b>Key Knowledge</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hindus believe that the real self does not die but goes on and assumes another body of a living thing. They also believe in karma which is the idea that for every action there is a reaction or consequence. There can be good and bad karma which will affect how you live in the next life. The aim of Hinduism is to leave the cycle of rebirth during reincarnation and become one with the god Brahma. This is called Moksha.</li> <li>Muslims believe that all through life you have two angels on your shoulders judging your deeds. If you have committed more good deeds than bad, you will go to Heaven (Jannah) and if you have committed more bad deeds than good you will go to hell (Jahannam). Until judgement day, the soul waits for Allah to make the decision.</li> <li>Christians believe that physical death still happens, but those who live a good life and believe in God and Jesus Christ will be a place in Heaven. Christians believe that after death, God will judge them for the deeds they have done during their lifetime.</li> <li>Humanists believe that people have one life to live - there is no afterlife. As a result, they focus on being happy and making the most of their life. They also believe they have a duty to support others and believe a full life is one that contributes to the lives of others as well.</li> </ul>
