They enquired scientifically and came to the conclusion that using multiple pulleys decreases the amount of force necessary to move an object. Well done class Silver Birch.'

Assembly messages: kindness and respect


On Monday and Tuesday in assembly we again spoke to the children about kindness and respect. We have reflected on ways in which we show kindness.
