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## Key Knowledge

- Stephen Wiltshire is an artist who uses small marks and lines to create city scenes from memory
- Outlines can be created simply by changing pencil grip and pressure rather than drawing a solid line
- Stippling is a technique of creating texture, tone and shape by using dots
- Putting dots closer creates a more shaded effect and placing them further apart makes the object appear lighter
- There a range of stippling styles (standard, large stipple, circular stipple, curved stipple)
