Key Knowledge:

- When we are using 'on + verb', this can either mean 'they're' or 'let's'. We have to use context and read around the words to understand which one.
- When saying the first of the month, we use 'le premier' and when writing this, we write '1er'.
- When saying your age. The phrase 'J'ai ...ans, directly translates to 'I have...years'. This is because the French say you 'have' the years, rather than you 'are' the years. In English we would say 'Julie's birthday', in French this is phrased as 'the birthday of Julie'. Eg, l'anniversaire de Julie.
