<p>Carlton is a village.</p> <p>Villages are small settlements with a small number of houses for a few hundred people.</p> <p>Selby and Goole are towns</p> <p>A town is a larger settlement than a village. More people live in a town – normally a couple of thousand - so they need more homes and more shops.</p> <p>York and Doncaster are cities.</p> <p>Cities are the largest kind of settlements and often have millions of people living in them.</p> <p>Human features are things made by humans</p> <p>Physical features are things which would be here even if there were no people around</p>
