#### 'Good' Ofsted Outcome

On Wednesday I was incredibly pleased to finally be able to write to you to share the outcome and report from our recent Ofsted inspection. We are officially a 'Good school' and received a 'Good' grading in all areas of the inspection framework.

As you know we had a 2-day our 'graded' inspection on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

The summary of this visit is:



The quality of education: GoodBehaviour and attitudes: GoodPersonal development: Good

- Leadership and management: Good

- Early years provision: Good



As I explained on Wednesday this outcome was not a surprise to us in any way. We have been self-assessing as a good school for a considerable time now, with this view corroborated by independent external sources too. Whether with potential new parents on school visits, with our Local Governing Board, as staff team or in the wider community, I have made no secret of this self-assessment. So overall it really pleasing to finally have the 'official' external validation of the progress we have made as a school over the past few years. It also helps to demonstrate that we know our school well!

It is important to note that in the ever-changing educational playing field, and despite the huge challenges of past few years, such as the Covid pandemic, and funding crisis in education and the wider cost of living crisis (utility bills ) for us all, I am particularly pleased that we have made such progress. Our school has moved on massively in this time, despite these challenges. The inspectors also acknowledged that we have clearly and successfully addressed all 8 areas that were left for us when we were inspected in March 2019, prior to our voluntary academisation, as Carlton in Snaith Community Primary School.

The report itself captures some really strong elements of our school however in my opinion, it only scratches the surface (which I understand is the nature of the process) and doesn't fully celebrate the warmth, ethos and overall atmosphere in enough depth. However, there is no dispute that the report is really positive!

Again, without wanting to repeat myself I would really like to take the opportunity to acknowledge and to thanks the following people:

- The pupils they are brilliant and we love working with them!
- My hardworking, caring, passionate, skilful staff team
- Our loyal, supportive and caring Local Governing Board (LGB),
- Our superb colleagues from SET (Selby Educational Trust) our decision to join SET was a great one for our school!
- You! For your engagement, understanding and support of our lovely school.

I have re-attached a copy of the report for you as we noticed a small error in the final report which now has been amended.

I hope you have enjoyed reading the inspection report. Thanks to all of you who have spoken to me on the gate or at parent - teacher consultations this week about this successful report. I think possibly the thing I'm most pleased with is that nobody is surprised – that's because we all already knew we were a good school!
