Key Knowledge

- When a noun ends with a consonant such as, 'chat', 'chien' and 'lapin', it is a silent last consonant. We would pronounce these as, 'sha', 'she-ah' and 'lap-ah'
- When we are introducing a family pet and we would like to give its name, we would use the phrase 'qui s'appelle', meaning 'who is called'. We pronounce 'Qui' as the word 'key'.
- Using the age related French vocabulary to expand a sentence eg: 'J'ai un chien' can become 'J'ai un chat qui s'appelle Spot'.
- When we use the question 'as-tu?' we need to add on what it might be that the person does or doesn't have eg, 'As-tu un chat?' or 'As-tu un animaux?' We can re-call on previous learning by adding other nouns eg: 'As-tu un soeur?' meaning 'have you got a sister?'
