
Other things this week:

Each week I have been sharing with you feedback from our recent Ofsted visit and report.



Reminders:

 World Book Day reminder – Thursday 7th March - Costumes needed!!! This year themes is simply a character you love from any book. We encourage you and your children to be as imaginative and creative as you can be – we do not expect expensive bought costumes, as home made and clever ideas are sometimes even more effective.



- <u>Clubs attendance</u>: All children who have signed up for a club should attend their club unless we have been informed in advance. Over the past couple of weeks a few of year 5 and 6 pupils who walk home have been picking and choosing whether they attend -we politely ask for a commitment to attend regularly.
- <u>Supervision of pupils on site</u>: Only Year 5 and Year 6 children with permission to walk to school, should be on school site without an adult (or older sibling) supervising them this is particularly important at the start of the day when staff are not on duty until doors open at 8.40 am. Thanks for your support with this we want to keep everyone safe!

 pedometer/step count facility, that doesn't allow calls, such as a 'fitbit' or 'garmin' type
 product are indeed permitted.
