

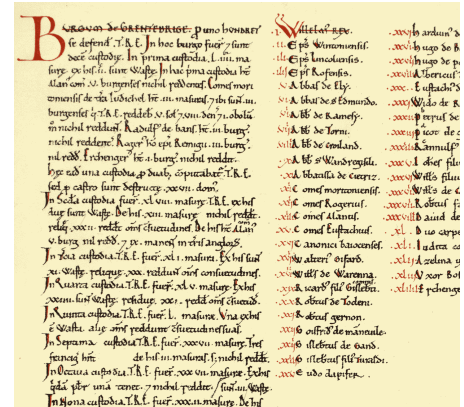

Domesday book	A survey designed to record everything that people owned in England was ordered by William the Conqueror. He could know how much tax was owed to him.	Ancestry	Your ancestors who lived a long time ago and is the origin of your family (family background).
Jacobean	A Jacobean building piece of furniture, or work of art was built or produced in Britain in the style of the period between 1603 and 1625.	Aristocracy	A class or group of people believed to be superior (as in rank, wealth, or intellect).
Peasantry	A peasant is a poor person (low income, little education and low social status) who works on the land where farming is still a common way of life.

Key Knowledge

- There has been a settlement in Carlton since before the Norman conquest, when it was known by the Anglo-Saxon name '**Ceorwl Tun**'. This meant peasant town.
- Carlton was a very small and quiet place. The people were farmers and peasants. Everyone lived and worked in the village or on the estate at Carlton (now called Carlton towers).
- Carlton's roots in peasantry are recognisable even now in the village architecture which was mainly provided by the Stapletons and later Beaumont families. All these families provided both employment and housing for the local labour force.
- Robert de Bruis was mentioned in the Domesday book as the holder of Carlton Estate.
- Carlton towers was used as an auxiliary hospital for people coming home from war.
- Lord Gerald Fitzalan-Howard and his wife moved into Carlton towers. They still live there but have changed parts of the house and run it as a business. The Fitzalan-Howards, one of the oldest aristocratic families in Britain.
